ANGELENO CORPS PROGRAM ENROLLMENT INFORMATION AND

APPLICATION PROCESS

EFFECTIVE DATE

This information bulletin is effective upon date of issue.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this information bulletin is to inform the WorkSource Centers (WSCs), YouthSource Centers (YSCs), and the Performance Partnership Pilot (P3) partners about the Angeleno Corps Program enrollment and application Process.

BACKGROUND

The Angeleno Corps Program is a centerpiece of Mayor Eric Garcetti's equity and justice agenda and a core investment of the City of Los Angeles in youth development and career pathways for young Angelenos. The Angeleno Corps is a 10-month service, support, and education program designed to engage young people in community recovery efforts in our City's neighborhoods most impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and historic and present racial oppression.

The Angeleno Corps program offers hands-on work experience and educational support for 18-24 year olds living in Los Angeles. Corps members selected for this program will work part-time (approximately 10-15 hours a week) in one of four civic engagement areas while continuing their education at a local community college or another educational program. Corps members will earn a \$1,000 monthly stipend and a one-time \$1,000 scholarship grant at the completion of the program. This program will start this fall

SERVICE AREAS:

Corps will learn and work in one of four career areas over 10 months:

- Education and Child Care: Corps may work and learn on the job at after-school programs, child care programs, or tutoring and mentoring programming.
- Health and Environmental Justice: Corps may work and learn on the job in hospitals, clinics, health outreach settings, or participate in environmental justice/climate advocacy.
- <u>Tech & Digital Assistance</u>: Corps may work and learn on the job to close digital/Internet access gaps, provide senior digital access, explore coding and computer science.
- Immigration Advocacy: Corps may work and learn on the job performing outreach, or providing assistance for legal filings to immigrant communities, including DACA recipients.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Selected Corps members will be:

- 18-24 years old
- Living within the City of Los Angeles
- Enrolled in a Los Angeles Community College, and/or
- Enrolled at a YouthSource Center
