3. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES- (2.13.24 SBC Meeting Mins) (SBC Minutes 3/19/24)

A. COMMISSIONER JACKSON motioned to approve the February 13, 2024 & March 19, 2024 minutes. COMMISSIONER TORRES seconded the motion. The motion PASSED

4. COMPREHENSIVE PLASTIC REDUCTION PROGRAM

A. Presentation of Comprehensive Plastic Reduction Program - Paul Cobian, Environmental Affairs Officer, LA Sanitation

I. Comprehensive Plastic Reduction Program:

- A. Paul Cobian presented the program targeting LA city's 4 million residents.
- B. Emphasis on addressing the 6 billion metric tons of plastic waste.

II. City Ordinances on Single-Use Plastics:

- A. Eight motions since 2010, focusing on bans for expanded polystyrene and plastic carry-on bags.
- B. Recent ordinances passed in May 2023 with support from nonprofits and industry associations.

III. Business Outreach and Education:

- A. A team formed in 2023 to educate businesses, especially large corporations, about waste ordinances.
- B. Outreach efforts include in-person visits and mailers to inform about styrofoam bans.

IV. Pilot Programs for Businesses:

- A. Christina from LASAN discussed helping 120 food service establishments transition to reusable products.
- B. This initiative impacted over 6,000 seats city-wide.

V. Upstream and Downstream Measures:

- A. Strategies to reduce single-use plastics by expanding facilities for recyclable materials and solid waste.
- B. Continuous initiatives and collaboration are necessary to achieve sustainability.

VI. Behavior Change and Education:

- A. Education is crucial to address litter issues, emphasizing avoiding styrofoam and plastic bags.
- B. Advocacy for supporting small businesses in implementing sustainable practices.
- C. COMMISSIONER JACKSON motioned to draft an advocacy letter for small businesses for Council File No. 210664, a follow-up discussion at the Small Business Commission Special Meeting on July 30, 2024. The motion PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

5. CASHLESS RETAIL BAN - CONTINUED

A. Presentation of Cashless Retail Ban Survey - Lizeth Escobedo, Management Analyst, EWDD

I. Cash Flow and Credit Issues:

- •Small businesses face challenges with cash flow management, access to credit, and fraud susceptibility.
- High fees from credit card and financing companies lead to a preference for cash transactions.

II. Fraud and Safety Concerns:

- Counterfeiting and safety issues necessitate clear language and education for small businesses.
- Engaging banks to address unbanked populations and further studying the impact on small businesses.

III. Implementation and Safety Nets:

- Struggles with implementing new measures and protecting against fraud and lawsuits.
- Discussions on helping businesses stay on track with their objectives.
